COME TO AN SSMPA PROGRAM MEETING!

<u>Monday, April 21, 2003</u> Phyllis Power, Director of the Leonis Adobe, will give us a conversational presentation of this historical landmark. Located in Calabasas, the Leonis Adobe, referred to as "A California Legend" is an important hands-on piece of history that has been preserved almost in its entirety. Phyllis is a very interesting speaker -- oh, the stories she will tell!

Monday, May 19, 2003 SSMPA member Dr. Jeffery T. Burkhart, Fletcher Jones Professor of Biology, University of La Verne, will bring live specimens and speak about local venomous animals. Among Dr. Burkhart's recent distinctions are 1996 Outstanding University Science Educator, Oklahoma Science Teacher's Assn., Marquis Who's Who in Science & Technology, 1997 - present; Glenn Doyle Excellence in Teaching Award, Phillips Univ., 1997, and Who's Who Among America's Teachers, 7th edition, 2002. Dr. Burkhart, a distant relative of Minnie Palmer, grew up in Chatsworth, spending much of his youth with the Shepler boys in the Santa Susana Mountains.
