Presenter: Kathleen Semple Delaney, PhD, Ecologist, National Parks Service (NPS) Researcher - Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area (SMMNRA)

Wildlife Populations (flying and crawling) are finding navigation between habitat areas of the Santa Monica Mountains ... Simi Hills ... Santa Susana Mountains is risky business. Urbanization, freeways, and fragmented landscapes can limit animal movements resulting in a lack of population connectivity. The study of habitat fragmentation in this region is a study Delaney worked on as a joint project with NPR/SMMNRA and Robert N. Fisher, USGS Western Ecology Research Center, and Seth P.D. Riley, Wildlife Ecologist for National Park Service – Thousand Oaks. The research/study focused on a genetics study of Wrentit, Western Fence Lizard and three local lizard species reporting the consequences of habitat fragmentation that results in inbreeding, loss of genetic diversity and local extinction. The study supports the need to protect the wildlife corridor/open space, native plants, trees, and chaparral to ensure that birds and other animals in our region will continue to survive




A Memorial, Tribute, and Celebration of Jan's Life March 25, 2011
